**ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS** \$50,000,000 (Dept. Of Commerce)

**BROADBAND TECHNOLOGY OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM** \$4,700,000,000 (Dept of Commerce, includes colleges)

**VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN PREVENTION AND PROSECUTION PROGRAMS**  
\$225,000,000 (VAWA, includes housing)

**STATE AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT ASSISTANCE** There are 7 distinctive programs on law enforcement, includes children and "COPS"

**Community Development Financial Institutions Fund Program Account** \$100,000,000

**SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION** (several programs)

**ECONOMIC STIMULUS LENDING PROGRAM FOR SMALL BUSINESSES** (several programs)

**EMERGENCY FOOD AND SHELTER** \$100,000,000 (includes to expedite the recovery efforts from Hurricanes Katrina and Rita within the Gulf Coast Region.

**MANAGEMENT OF LANDS AND RESOURCES** (several programs Bureau of Land Management)

**INDIAN GUARANTEED LOAN PROGRAM ACCOUNT** \$10,000,000

**INDIAN HEALTH SERVICES and INDIAN HEALTH FACILITIES** (separately funded programs)

**National Endowment for the Arts** \$50,000,000 (does not include funds for the Smithsonian)

**TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICES** \$3,950,000,000 (includes summer employment, youth, dislocated workers, YouthBuild)

**COMMUNITY SERVICE EMPLOYMENT FOR OLDER AMERICANS** \$120,000,000

**OFFICE OF JOB CORPS \$250,000,000**

**HEALTH RESOURCES AND SERVICES \$2,500,000,000 (several programs)**

**PAYMENTS TO STATES FOR THE CHILD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT BLOCK  
\$2,000,000,000**

**CHILDREN AND FAMILIES SERVICES PROGRAMS \$3,150,000,000 (several programs  
including Head Start and helping folks get benefits)**

**AGING SERVICES PROGRAMS \$100,000,000,**

**PREVENTION AND WELLNESS FUND (for Center for Disease Control)**

**Education for the Disadvantaged \$13,000,000,000 (a number of programs including special  
education and Pell grants)**

**Corporation for National and Community Service \$160,000,000**

**DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (Includes Public Housing and  
Native American housing)**

**COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUND \$1,000,000,000 (very lengthy list and directions, includes  
homeless prevention, abandoned buildings, lead)**
